House System

Goals:

- To provide/harbor a sense of community and belonging
- encourage academic excellence
- reward positivity
- foster school and community spirit



What is the house system?

- In the house system a school is divided into subunits called 'houses' and each student is assigned to one house.
- Students in each house participate in activities together.
- Houses may compete with one another, thereby encouraging group loyalty.

**Think Harry Potter and the Sorcerers Stone

How does it work?

- EMS students are divided into 7 groups.
- Groups include students from all grades, as well as staff members.
- Each group is assigned a color: Purple,
 Blue, Dark Green, Lime, Orange, Pink, Yellow
- Many school activities are centered around the houses



- Healthy competition is used to encourage a sense of belonging to the school "family"
- A point system is used to encourage healthy competition

School-wide House Activities

- The third Friday of each month is house color day (Students wear their house color and their button or bracelet).
- Other house color days-TBA
- Team Building day- September
- Festive Fridays- House related activities
- Team building day September
- 2 Inter-house Track and Field Day May



Egling School Houses Point System

Purpose: to encourage healthy competition in order to place importance/emphasis on our goals.

- Houses will get points for positive behaviors/involvement/etc.
- Once points are earned they cannot be taken away
- At grading periods awards will be given
 - Perpetual trophy in the 4-6 library
 - Treats/activities



Egling School Houses Point System

Students/houses can gain points for the following:

- Wearing house shirts on color days or Egling shirts on red days
- Participating in dress up days, fundraising, and other school activities.
- Great/Exemplary Behavior
- Demonstrating measurable improvement in subjects/testing/AR & AM scores
- Honor roll /Academic excellence etc.
- School service hours/activities/fund raisers (i.e. canned foods drive)
- Winners of rallies/track meet or sports days/etc.
- % of house with no behavioral referrals/detentions etc. at end of grading periods
- Perfect Attendance

Role of Leadership Class

- Leadership students are divided into the houses
- The leadership students "head up" the leadership house groups
- The ASB "House Dept." head up counting and tracking points
- Organization and running of projects and activities is completed by leadership with the cooperation of EMS staff and students and parent volunteers.
